**Paper 1: Living with the physical environment** is about physical processes and systems, how they change, and how people interact with them at a range of scales and in a range of places.

Paper 2: Challenges in the human environment is about human processes and systems, how they change both spatially and temporally. They are studied in a range of places, at a variety of scales and include places in various states of development.

Paper 3: Geographical applications and skills is about identifying, understanding and appreciating the interrelationships between the different aspects of your geography study.
